CLASSROOM NEWS

From Year 3

Year 3 have had a busy week completing our science learning about light and shadow. We have made leaflets containing advice about keeping safe in the sun and investigated what happens to shadows when we change the position of the torch.




From Year 4

In English, Year 4 are learning about Shakespeare. As our topic hook, we have been practising the play Macbeth. We made props and used sound effects to make it more realistic. We then performed it outside, using the mound as a stage for our play.

From Year 5

This week the children have been introduced to their new topic - Victorians. In English we have begun investigating the novel Street Child. The class worked in small groups to infer as much information from the front covers as possible. They used their ideas to predict what the story may be about, when it is set and who the main character might be. As a class we then looked at the first chapter and answered comprehension questions using A.P.E (Answer, Prove it, Explain). The children really strived to include evidence from the text to support their answers and deepen their understanding.



From Year 6

Year 6 have jumped back in to school after a fantastic residential. This week we are planning and preparing for our residential presentation to parents and the school next week. We are looking at ratio and scaling in Maths and beginning our sequence of work on writing biographies in English. We hooked our interest by interviewing members of staff, so we could build on our research skills as well as asking anecdotal questions which would engage the reader. In PE we are playing rounders, working on batting, and throwing skills.
