YEAR EYFS

This week in EYFS, we have been busy using our phonics knowledge to write short captions for pictures. Working in pairs, we practised writing these captions while learning to use finger spaces with our 'Peter Pointer'. Miss Freeman has been so impressed with the perseverance we have shown in writing tasks! In maths, we have been refining our counting skills. Today, we partnered with a friend to play a track game, racing to reach ten. We had to take turns and count carefully to ensure we moved the same amount as the dice showed.







YEAR 1

We have had a very busy start to our first term back after Christmas. We have introduced our new topic for Geography on "What does my local area have to offer?" and the children have started looking at what Bocking has to offer. In maths we have begun looking at place value to 20 and built these numbers with multilink, base 10 and bead strings. In science we went on our first season walk of the year and noticed that the ground looked very hard and that the trees still had no leaves on. It was also very cold so we made sure we wrapped up warm with coats, hats and gloves.

YEAR 2

In English this week we have learnt about adjectives, commas and apostrophes. I liked the adjectives the most because I like making my sentences better (Lily).
