#### YEAR 3

This week we have been focussing on completing our innovated Egyptian Adventure Story and are excited to be writing our own version next week. We have also been finding out all about mummification and are now fully trained in the process! Today we have set up our own mummification of an apple and a tomato, we are looking forward to seeing the end result.

#### YEAR 4

This week in Maths, we have been tackling some tricky topics: dividing 2 and 3 digit numbers. The children have all shown great perseverance and never gave up. In English, we have been carrying on with our biography writing and have now produced a piece all about Henry VIII. Did you know that Henry was King for 37 years! Next week we will be doing research to independently produce a biography about a person of our choice. We have really enjoyed our Tudor topic this term and it has been great to hear comments from parents about how the children have been sharing their learning with you all. Another fantastic week of hard work and determination. Well done Year 4.

#### YEAR 5

In Year 5 this week, we have begun our second unit on fractions. We are becoming very competent at multiplying fractions now and can even multiply a mixed number by an integer! In our geography lesson, we learnt about thematic maps and created one of our own to show population loss during WWII. Today, we dedicated the day to study art. We learnt and practised sketching techniques before applying them to our own art piece inspired by Henry Moore.



#### YEAR 6

This week we have been focused on the local history and on Monday walked around the village. We went to the windmill and sketched, we went to Dorewards House, The Crittalls houses, The Almshouses and looked for buildings from different years. We took lots of pictures and have created a photo album of the places we visited. In science we classified different mammals, identifying different ways we could classify based on similarities and differences. We have now started writing our suspense narratives and hope to share them next week on open afternoon.
