BOCKING'S AMAZING PUPILS!

It has been another packed week of learning for children and adults here at Bocking this week. We hosted visitors from another school who came to visit us to see and discuss our behaviour system and policy. Since introducing the current system last summer we have seen a huge improvement in the behaviour of pupils in class and around the school. The positive and respectful attitudes that are shown around the school have been remarked upon by many visitors to the school throughout the year and the improved learning behaviours in class go hand in hand with the high expectations we have for our pupils throughout their learning. I feel very proud to be able to show off our amazing pupil behaviours and high expectations.

Our teachers have also started training on our new phonics programme that will be introduced in September. There will be parent workshops and online resources for parents to use that we will add to our website in September so that all parents can follow the same methods that we are using in school.


Also in September we will be reintroducing our School Council, this will be different from the Attain Pupil Forum in year 6 and will be an opportunity for all year groups to have a voice on different events and ways for the school to improve. To become a School Council member, the children will be asked to write a short paragraph about why they should be voted in as the year group representative and then the class will vote for 2 representatives from each year. One of the main responsibilities of the School Council will be charity fundraising.

Fundraising in school for different charities is something that I advocate, so that our children learn about the causes and issues that others face. Our School Council in September will be scheduling charity events throughout the year so that we can raise money for causes that the children choose. We already have a list of the charities that have been in contact with us to ask for our support! One of the charities that we will be fundraising for is Gt Ormond Street Hospital. GOSH have treated my daughter since the age of 4 weeks old and every 3 months she goes to the hospital for treatment and check-ups. I know there are others in our school community for whom they have played an enormous part in their young lives treating some very serious and complicated conditions. To be able to give something back to them I will be running the London Marathon in October '22 for GOSH to raise awareness of the amazing treatment and support they offer to so many children and families in our community. This is not only a 'bucket list' challenge for me but also allows me to fundraise for a charity very close to my heart.

I am trying to raise as much as I possibly can for Gt Ormond Street, and I appreciate that there are many charities fundraising at the moment.
