### CLASSROOM NEWS...

#### YEAR 3

In English, we have been learning about kenning and quatrain poems. We have written our own ones about Campania which has been great. In maths we have been finishing off addition and subtraction. We have enjoyed this unit and now know how to use column method. In geography, we learnt about environmental issues in Campania and Essex. We are going to make sure we throw our rubbish in the bin and recycle more. In science, we have finished our wormeries; the worms are now settled into their new home and are eating lots of organic matter. Mr Wood has very kindly offered to take them home for Christmas dinner! Next term, we are looking forward to maths (learning multiplication and division) and English. #### YEAR 4

For the last week of term, we have been finishing up lots of our learning. In topic, we answered our enquiry question 'Is the Greek Legacy worth remembering?' – we had very interesting views on this and ultimately decided that a lot of what we have today is really from the Ancient Greeks! We finished our pottery by painting in red-figure and black-figure styles, and they look amazing and much like the ones we have been researching and exploring in Art. In maths, we have been starting to understand multiplying 2-digit and 2-digit numbers and dividing. We have really persevered with this, and our times tables have helped. In English, we wrote some free verse poetry about darkness and performed them to the class. Finally, we wish you all a Merry Christmas and a very Happy New Year!

#### YEAR 5

Year 5 have been persevering brilliantly in their maths lessons and are now confidently finding equivalent fractions, mixed numbers, and improper fractions. This week, they have applied these skills to adding fractions with improving success. In English, they have really impressed us with some thought-provoking narrative writing focused on the Christmas Truce. Their elegant word choices made their pieces moving and helped readers to understand the meaning of Christmas and the symbolism of hope during the truce. In Design Technology, the children have learned how to use cams to make their own Viking longboats move across the high seas. We were very impressed with their thorough research, thoughtful designs, and prototype making, as they solved problems along the way. They used the equipment with great maturity, producing high-quality products. This term, Year 5 have shown great improvement in their learning behaviour. Every day, they are working harder, doing more, and presenting their work with greater neatness—truly embodying our class mantra. Well done, Year 5, and Merry Christmas!

#### YEAR 6

We have been working really hard in our maths lessons where we have had to persevered to ensure that we understand fractions well. In English, we have been ambitious when writing our Christmas poems: we have used more adventurous and precise vocabulary to create imagery. For our science learning, we have been designing and creating Christmas cards with an electrical circuit. In geography we have been practising our research and presentation skills as we each presented our findings on a continent to the class.
