Dear Parents and Carers,

Some of our Year 2 and 3 pupils participated in a Tag Rugby festival at Braintree Rugby Club this week, demonstrating exceptional enthusiasm and sportsmanship. For some, this event marked their first encounter with the distinctive oval ball, while others seized the opportunity to showcase skills honed outside school form their club training.

Our Pupil Forum members, Hannah and Anashe, have started a comprehensive project focusing on equality and diversity across the school and the trust. This week, they conducted their first interviews with our Heads of School, Poppy and Fletcher. Their research will include interviews with various members of our school community including the school council and staff and a planned visit to Gosfield School to engage with their pupils and staff. This research project will culminate in July with a presentation of their findings to the Academy Trust Board, a testament to the questioning and presentational skills we aim to promote in our pupils.
