'THE CHILDREN'S BEHAVIOUR WAS GOOD AND THERE WAS A CALM ATMOSPHERE ACROSS THE SCHOOL.'

During a Trust visit last week it was observed that 'the children's behaviour was good and there was a calm atmosphere across the school.' The new behaviour system that was introduced in March focusses on recognising positive behaviours regularly throughout the day culminating in TOPS time (Time and Opportunity to Practice Skills) at the end of each day. The consistent approach to the behaviour policy enables the children to understand the high expectations of behaviour we have during their day in school and we find that the vast majority of children show excellent learning behaviours both in class and on the playground. Those that find it harder to keep to the high standards we expect understand there are consequences to their actions and will have the opportunity to reflect on their actions with support from an adult.

Please ask your children about their 'peg moves' to learn more from a child's perspective. Next we will be working on ensuring that the children know who to report incidents to so they know that it will be dealt with swiftly and effectively.

Bubbles

As the weather starts to deteriorate and the field becomes unusable during break and lunchtimes, we may need to alter our KS1 and KS2 'bubbles' so that we can accommodate more children outside. We will be looking at staggering our lunchtimes so that there are less children outside at one time therefor creating a more enjoyable and purposeful lunchbreak.
