Firstly, our year 3 students embarked on a captivating journey to the Cambridge University Botanic Garden (CUBG). This remarkable garden boasts an impressive collection of over 8,000 plant species from around the globe, serving as a hub for teaching and research. The students had the opportunity to explore the diverse landscapes and witness the drama of plant diversity firsthand, fostering a deeper appreciation for the natural world. Meanwhile, our year 4 pupils ventured to Colchester Zoo, where they consolidated their learning about rainforests and living things and habitats. YEAR EYFS

This week in Early Years, we have been challenging ourselves to independently write about our half term. We have amazed Miss Freeman, with how much our confidence has grown towards writing tasks! Alongside our growing confidence, we came back from the holidays to discover our broad beans had grown too! We have planted them in bags, in different areas of our classroom. Surprisingly, the one pegged to the number line has grown the most, despite being in the air and away from direct sunlight. We are looking forward to replanting our broad beans in hope they grow beans.

YEAR 1

It has been another great start to the half term this week in the Year 1. All the children have settled well into their learning and are enjoying their new topics. This week we were introduced to a poem about the seasons and then learnt about rhyming words. In math's we have started our place value to 100 unit and the children were challenged to complete a missing 100 square independently. In PE we have started to learn and practice the sports disciplines for sports day and we are very excited for this. As a class, year 1 have been given the opportunity to learn about the Royal Opera House and we will be learning a short performance over the coming weeks.

YEAR 2

This week in maths we have been learning about centimetres and metres, we enjoyed it even though it was a bit tricky. We liked going on the playground and measuring objects with a metre stick. I am I metre and 30cm (Blake). In English, we have been writing nonsense poems, they are very funny and silly. You have to make up random words which made us laugh. We are writing a class nonsense poem on animals; my animal is a meerkat and Matilda's is a seahorse. In P.E. we played a cricket game and we found it a mixture of hard and easy.
