YEAR EYFS

This week in Early Years we have been creating our own story maps to sequence the story of 'The Enormous Turnip.' We have used these as prompts to retell the story aloud. Miss Freeman has been amazed to hear us, use the same vocabulary as in the story. Like the story, we have also been doing some of our own planting. We have sunflowers starting to grow and we are also experimenting with broad bean seeds. We have decided to plant them in places, to see where they would best grow – Mr Leonard even has one hiding in his classroom!



YEAR 1

Year 1 have been very busy with all their learning over the last couple of weeks. In Science we have been watching our flowers grow and each day the children have been very excited to see how much they have changed overnight. In maths we have been exploring quarters within our fraction unit. The children have been very good at noticing that to find a quarter each group needs to be equal. We are very excited to start our enterprise project next week and can't wait to share this with you on Friday afternoon.

YEAR 2

In maths we have been learning non-unit and unit fractions, we found them easy once we practiced. In geography we have been looking at hot and cold places, some hot places are Africa, Australia, Brazil and Papua New Guinea (which looks like a dinosaur on the map) some cold places are Canada, Greenland, Antarctica, Sweden and Finland. We know this because the further away from the equator the colder it is. In English we have been writing our stories, some of us are writing about land animals and some of us are writing about sea animals. They are going on an adventure to meet their friends. We are happy with our stories and I think it is one of my best pieces of writing. We finished sewing our animal puppets this week in DT, it was really tricky but we had lots of fun and I really liked my puppet, some of us had some really funny animals!
