# **CLASSROOM NEWS** From Year 3

Year 3 have been looking at persuasive writing in English and are looking at the various techniques we can use to persuade others. In Maths we have begun to learn about fractions and understand what fraction notation means. We have planted some potatoes in bags outside our classroom and some pea seeds in pots which we are keeping in the classroom until the weather is a little warmer at night. We were amazed to see the tops of the potato plants coming out of the soil, we have covered them up now so the shoots will keep growing and increase our potato crop.
