As we start the final term of this academic year, I find myself reflecting on the journey our pupils have undertaken and the significant progress they continue to make in their education. This week's assembly centred on preparing ourselves for the year ahead whilst acknowledging the goals we must still achieve before the current year concludes. This week, Year 3 have come back with a brilliant mindset to do more than what is expected. The children have really impressed us with their application of knowledge across the curriculum. In geography, they were able to use their knowledge of rocks and soils from autumn and apply it to how mountains are formed. Ask them if they can explain the five ways mountains are formed – you'll be amazed! They have also been extremely engaged in our grammar unit where we have used a film about a dragon slayer as a stimulus. We were blown away by their use of inverted commas, apostrophes and conjunctions. In maths, we have shown perseverance while learning about statistics. While this hasn't been easy, the children have been resilient and keen to improve. The same gritty determination was shown as we started our athletics unit this week. The children were keen to fine tune their sprinting technique and didn't give up- even when they were tired. Keep up the hard work!

YEAR 4

Year 4 have had a fantastic time using the animated short "Pigeon: Impossible" as a stimulus for our writing. We've been exploring adverbs, fronted adverbials, and complex sentences to bring our descriptions to life. In maths, we've been working hard on our times tables in preparation for the upcoming Times Tables Check next week—keep practising! In topic, we've been learning all about the flora and fauna of the rainforest, discovering how different species have adapted to survive in such a unique environment. PE has been full of energy as we've been running and preparing for Sports Day. Although we got caught in the rain during our trials, everyone showed great resilience and gave it their best effort!

YEAR 5

We have kickstarted this first week back at school with some amazing learning! In English, we have been focusing on grammar and punctuation such as modal verbs, semi colons, direct speech and parenthesis, and using them in our writing. In maths, we have been focusing on negative numbers, how to recognise them in everyday life and ordering them on a number line. In science, we made a diagram of the first stages of human growth from a newborn to year one and we have began our geography topic by answering the enquiry question 'Can the world survive without rivers?'. What a fantastic week to start off the Summer term!

YEAR 6

Year 6 have had a brilliant week focussing on Geography and PSHE. The children have learned lots about climate change including how they can help reduce it. In PSHE, the children have been working on their secondary school transition and setting personal goals. The children have shown how reflective and empathetic they can be during our No Outsider lessons. It is an exciting time in Year 6 as the roles for the production have been cast and now it is time for rehearsing!
