YEAR EYFS

This week was the children's first full week at school, and they've done a fantastic job settling into the classroom routine. I expect they'll be quite tired by the weekend! The class has been busy exploring their new surroundings, making friends, and adjusting to school life. They've enjoyed many exciting 'firsts' – from their first PE lesson with Mr Porte, to using whiteboards and pens during lessons, and even listening to a violin for the first time. Mrs Pennington, Miss Bednall, and I are excited to be part of their learning journey. They've already impressed us with their recognition of initial sounds and confident counting – we can't wait to see what's next for them!

YEAR 1

It has been an awesome week in year 1. All the children have been super busy with their learning and are starting to display some really positive attitudes towards their activities. In Math's we have begun looking at our first unit, and we started by sorting objects into different groups, then started to count these as well. In Art we explored the colour wheel and mixed the 3 primary colours, to make orange, purple and green. In English we have text mapped our first story – 'Lost in the Toy Museum' and next week we are going to create actions to help us remember the order of the story

YEAR 2

In history we have learned about Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole, they are both significant people from our past. That means they changed the world and made a difference to something. In maths we have been looking at partitioning numbers, using part-part-whole models, we have found this quite hard, but it's easier now than at the beginning of the week. In English we have been learning about Brunel and his steam trains. We did a text map about the story and on Monday we turned the classroom into a train and we went on a journey through the mountains.
