# YEAR 1

We have been very busy with all our learning this week in class. We started the week with our English hook and went on a trip down to the woods to find bears. We have been working very hard on our phonics and reading this week learning about different suffixes that can go at the end of some words. We introduced our final enquiry question and started to think about different types of weather we have seen in the United Kingdom. # YEAR 2

On Monday we had 'World Day' where we learnt about 3 countries around the world. They were India, Alaska and Nigeria. In Alaska we created northern light pictures using pastels and in Nigeria we made mud huts which made a lot of mess. We had to water down clay and mix in some straw and twigs to make it stick together. India was our favourite, we learnt how to Bollywood dance, which was really fun, and then we tried some Indian food. My favourite was mango (Luke) and mine was spicy samosas (Sienna). In maths we were learning about grams and temperature.
