From EYFS

We've had a fantastic week in Early Years. The children enjoyed watching KS2's finals day races on Wednesday. They watched them sensibly and cheered them on. We heard the Billy Goats Gruff story from the Trolls point of view and decided he is a kind troll afterall. The children have been practising their chopping skills and learning how to use a sharp knife safely. In Maths this week we have been learning how to subtract using pictorials. From Year 1

This half term we are learning about farming. For the last few weeks we have learnt that there are three types of farms in the UK. There are pastoral farms, arable farms and mixed farms. After learning about farms we researched and learns that soil, seed or blubs, water and sun are the main factors that a plant needs to grow. We wanted to see how plants grow, so we planted a sunflower seed and now we are looking after it! We are watering them every other day and measuring how tall it is getting, it is very exciting.

From Year 2

Year 2 have been busily writing their own versions of Jack and the Beanstalk. I have been amazed by their use of vocabulary and punctuation. We also wrote a nonchronological report on giants and then used this learning in our Science lessons to write about how to care for plants. In Maths, we have enjoyed measuring liquids and found it interesting to learn the difference between capacity and volume. The child have also been doing some beautiful art work, wave pictures using chalk and pastels. We are very excited for our Sports Day on Monday and looking forward to our picnics.
