Today we said "See you soon" to Mrs Rennie. Mrs Rennie has been at Bocking for over 10 years and has seen many families go through the school. She has a passion for the foundation subjects and has been the Science lead at Bocking for the last two years, improving and developing the subject so that teachers have the right knowledge, resources and the right balance of learning. This term has not been a quiet one. We have seen great learning from the children both in class and from their homework. The creative pieces that have been brought in over the term has shown just how hard some of you are working at home to consolidate your learning. We have had local authors visiting the school, Google Internet Legends with our VIP MP James Cleverly, NSPCC workshops, the Braintree Museum, Tiny Tales Story Teller, parents offering their time to talk to our EYFS children about their jobs and of course our Yr 6 residential. This is all on top of our TOPS time celebration, open door afternoon and parents evening, trips to the Wilderness Foundation and Cross Country event.

Yesterday, a group of children from Years 4, 5 and 6 travelled up to London (with a mini sight-seeing trip on the way past the Tower of London, the Shard, Tower Bridge, Big Ben and the London Eye) to see a performance of the ballet Cinderella at the Royal Opera House. The children showed exemplary behaviour throughout the trip and were a credit to the school. Although it was a long journey, the awe and wonder on the children's faces when we first found our seats in the theatre made it all worthwhile. This ballet has been newly staged, and we were lucky enough to witness a pumpkin disappearing into a flourish of glitter, staircases that stretched as far into the distance as the eye could see, and magical light shows creating falling snow across the stage. The children were enthralled by the lavish costumes and the world-class dancing they saw.

CLASSROOM NEWS...

YEAR EYFS

This week in Early Years, we finished off our topic 'people who help us' with a visit from Mr Doye, who is a firefighter. He spoke about what to do in an emergency, reminding us that you ring 999 and tell them that you need the fire brigade. After showing the children how important it is to stay low in a fire, Mr Doye told the class how sometimes the fire brigade is also called to help when someone is trapped. He said that they use big cutters, which are referred to as the 'jaws of life' to free people. The children were very inquisitive and had lots of well-thought-out questions for Mr Doye about his uniform, and the fire engine. After answering all the classes questions, Mr Doye spoke to the children about the importance of having two working fire alarms and asked the children to remind their parents to regularly check theirs at home.
