ENGAGED IN LEARNING

On the last Non Pupil Day, staff across the Academy Trust attended training on Oracy led by Jonathan Bond. The session explored practical ways to engage and motivate pupils in their own learning through the development of oracy skills. Oracy is the ability to communicate ideas, ask questions for understanding, and engage with others. Promoting oracy in the classroom builds speaking and listening skills. It can also help children improve their written language skills. With an oracy skillset, children can gain the vocabulary to say what they want to say and they'll learn how to structure thoughts in a way that makes sense to others.

NO PENS DAY

From this training, we held a 'no pens day' across the whole school. There was definitely a buzz of excitement when the children realised they didn't have to write anything all day but had the choice of recording their learning through different mediums. Throughout the day children were fully engaged, performing poetry, creating stories, explaining their mathematical thinking and going on their own bear hunts around the school playground. It was lovely to hear from our class ambassadors throughout Key Stage 2 about their learning when I visited their classrooms with some prospective parents.

CLASS AMBASSADORS

Our class ambassadors are pairs of children that explain the current learning to any visitor that comes to their class. This is yet another way our children are building their confidence in speaking and practising their conversational skills with adults. They made me very proud with the clarity of explanation of their learning and how they answered questions in such detail and with such confidence.

From Year 2

From Year 4

Year 4 have had a really busy week. We especially enjoyed No Pens Wednesday where we did lots of group work and drama. We acted out the Viking story of Beowulf, played games to help us learn our 3 times table and thought about how we can manage our emotions in PSHE.

From Year 1

Year 1 have been very busy with their learning this week. In Maths we have started a new topic on Place Value to 20. We have been counting forwards and backwards and writing our numbers in numerals and words. We have also been looking at tens and ones and have been using a part whole model to show how many tens and how many ones are in our numbers. We have also been looking at one more and one less for numbers within 20.

From EYFS

In Early Years this week, we have been starting to learn about the Nativity story. We have learnt lots of new vocabulary like 'frankincense' (not to be confused with Frankenstein!) 'manger' and 'Wise men.' We have continued to learn and practise our new letters in phonics and have been applying them in our free choosing time- writing letters, labelling pictures, and copying from letter mats.
