One of the highlights of the week was a special visit from Baloo, an extraordinary Essex Police Dog. Baloo's journey has been one of resilience and determination. Unfortunately, in October 2018, Baloo's career as a police dog was cut short when she was involved in an accident while pursuing a suspected criminal. Her injuries were severe, requiring metal plates to be inserted into her pelvis and the amputation of her front leg.

Despite the challenges she faced, Baloo's handler, PC Ashcroft, made the difficult decision to rehome her. This decision has allowed Baloo and her handler to share their experiences with us, visiting schools and teaching children about personal safety and the important role that police dogs play in keeping our community secure. Our students had the opportunity to interact with Baloo, asking insightful questions and thoroughly enjoying their time with her.







In other news, I am thrilled to announce the success of our boys' football team in their recent match against Shalford. They emerged victorious with a remarkable score of 7-3. What makes this achievement even more remarkable is that the match was played with an official sound ball, specifically designed for a young person from Shalford who is partially sighted. The boys adapted their tactics and played the ball on the ground, showcasing their versatility and determination. Well done, boys!

As we look ahead, I would like to inform you that our Year 6 children will be embarking on their residential trip to Mersea Outdoors next week. We wish them an unforgettable few days filled with fun and learning. Let's hope the weather is kind to them, as they have experienced everything from snow and gale-force winds to sunshine and showers over the past two years!

### YEAR 3
