ENRICHMENT AT BOCKING!

Dear Parents and Carers

This week has been full of wonderful enrichment activities for our curriculum starting on Monday with the VR day (virtual reality). Our pupils were transported to the Arctic to see penguins, visited landmarks throughout the world, such as Mount Everest to experience the world through virtual reality. We have also had numerous author visits throughout the week speaking to the children about becoming authors and the talking about the different types of stories they have written.

I think you will agree that it was wonderful to see all the children dressed up for World Book Day on Thursday– even though there was so much going on which was out of the norm; online lessons from the BBC, Nick Sharratt the illustrator giving real time workshops and even a visit from Mrs Flacks dad, who has written his own books, I am proud to say that the behaviour was as good as ever and the children had a lot of fun. A huge thank you goes to Mrs Champney for organising all the activities and the staff team for making it such a successful Book Week. The Book Fair will be available until Wednesday 9th March.

During World Book Day we also had our termly visit from the Trust. Just some of the things they noticed were that the children are developing preferences for reading because they are being exposed to an increasing range of books and are developing greater independence when learning by using the tools and equipment in classrooms with greater independence. This is just more evidence that, as a school, we continue to improve all the time.

Finally, after so much positive news to share with you from Bocking School, I would like to ask you for your help – Following Russia's devastating invasion of Ukraine, UK-AID, based in Felsted, will be leaving the UK on March 27th bound for Moldova, in support of refugees from Ukraine who have crossed over the Moldovan border, with three 18 tonne lorries of aid.

This week the children have enjoyed learning the story 'The Sleepy Bumblebee.' We have also been looking at different ways we can make 10 with smaller numbers, using different equipment.

From Year 1

Year 1 have had a busy week of learning. We started World Book Week with a live lesson from Julia Donaldson on Monday, listening to stories, poems and singing along to songs from her books. On Tuesday we started our new topic in English and came into our classroom in the morning to discover animal footprints! We didn't know how these footprints got into the classroom or who left them. We then received a letter giving us some clues to the creature that left them and we had to go on a mission to find the puzzle pieces in the playground to work out who it was! We found out it was a wolf! Our new story in English is a traditional tale called The Sheep and The Goat and this story has some bad wolves in it too!
