### **CLASSROOM NEWS**

#### From Year 3

Year 3 have had lots of excitement since we last wrote. We have completed our class novel Charlotte's Web, which we all loved. This week in guided reading we have been transfixed by The Iron Man by Ted Hughes and we have begged Mrs Rennie not to stop! In Science, we have been investigating what plants need to grow. We are observing lettuce plants under different conditions, the ones growing in the fridge (without warmth) and the dark (without light) are not looking great. At the end of last week, we observed the transport of water through flowers and celery. We were amazed at how quickly some food colouring changed our white flowers.



#### From Year 4

As part of our Talk for Writing unit we have been learning all about the Sahara Desert. We have looked closely at the structure of a non chronological report and used that layout to write our own one about Antarctica. Did you know that Antarctica is actually a desert as well? We have found out lots of interesting facts and the children have worked incredibly hard this week in English. In Maths, we have been learning to tell the time. This can be a very tricky area of learning however the children have definitely stepped up and rose to the challenge. In Art we have been continuing our artist study on British artist: John Dyer. We really honed in on the detail and painting techniques he uses in his work to recreate our own pieces based on his rainforest artwork.

#### From Year 5

This week year 5 have been looking closely at photographs of Midway Island. Using these images, the children have generated a range of adjectives to describe the setting. Everybody has really pushed themselves to extend their use of vocabulary and use more sophisticated word choices. The children then chose their favourite descriptive words to create a range of sentences using the Power of Three. They have really impressed the adults with their vivid expression and use of imagery. Well done year 5!

#### From Year 6

This week, Year 6 have immersed themselves in their writing and links to Shakespeare Rocks, our school production. We have written character descriptions, opening to a story, a sequel and a letter. We have also written an explanation text linked to our swimming, this half term. They have produced some fantastic work and should be immensely proud of themselves. We have begun our topic, on Electricity and have made circuits in a practical session. In preparation for leaving primary school, we have begun our taster days, visiting our chosen secondary school as well as completing transition work in class.
