Our Year 6 pupils were treated to an exceptional performance of Beauty and the Beast at Gosfield Prep school, further enriching their cultural exposure. The recent visit from our School Improvement Advisor returned positive feedback, which further evidenced the hard work our staff put in to making the curriculum as fun and as enriching as it can be. Parent Teacher Learning Conversations (TLCs) were notably successful, with our pupils demonstrating such pride in discussing their academic progress and showcasing their term's achievements.

I would also like to express my thanks to our PTSA for their tireless efforts in organising events that not only provide unique experiences for our pupils but also raise essential funds for the school. Their generous donations have enabled us to enhance our reading areas and will soon contribute to improvements in our EYFS outdoor space.
